

## Honouring Our Local Veterans

**Gunner Alan Bishop, Canadian Expeditionary Forces,** with the 7<sup>th</sup> Brigade Canadian Field Artillery and first cousin of William Avery Bishop. He was killed at the Battle of the Somme, September 1916.

**Sergeant Henry (Harry) Cecil Davis, Canadian Armed Forces,** with the Highland Light Infantry during the Second World War and landed in Normandy at Bernières-sur-Mer on D-Day.

**Corporal Carl Stacey Hopkins, Canadian Armed Forces,** enlisted with the Princess Patricia's Canadian Light Infantry in 1940 and would not talk about his experiences after the war, he was discharged in January 1946.

**Private George Grindley, Canadian Expeditionary Forces,** enlisted with Fifth Canadian Field Ambulance, Canadian Army Medical Corps, and was killed during the Battle of the Somme, his name is on the Vimy Memorial as he has no known grave in France.

**Corporal Brian Kay, Royal Canadian Air Force,** an Airframe and Aviation technician discharged in 2006. Worked on the CC137 and 707 Boeings, the CC130, Hercules and more.

**Private Herb MacDonald, Canadian Armed Forces,** was a Bren Gunner in the Lincoln and Welland Regiment during the Second World War and was said to be a "fine marksman in action."

**Master Corporal John Stinson, Canadian Armed Forces,** a Radio Operator who served on maneuvers in Germany during the Gulf War as well as in Eritrea, Africa.
